ALTOGETHER HISTORIC

Step back into the past with trips through Carrollton's Historic District, Historic City Cemetery, Georgia's oldest bookstore, Horton's Books and Gifts or the restored 1880s train Depot on Bradley. Stroll past the historic homes on Dixie, Tanner and Center streets and catch a glimpse of residential life in Carrollton's earlier days. Markers and memorials in and around the Historic Carroll County Courthouse tell about Creek Chief William McIntosh and Declaration of Independence signer (and the county's namesake) Charles Carroll and honor the Carroll Countians who fought and died in the service of our great nation. Learn about the community's former chief industry, textiles, from markers along the West Georgia Textile Heritage Trail or with a visit to the Southeastern Quilt and Textile Museum. Interpretive centers and signage at Historic Banning Mills and McIntosh Reserve Park tell stories of the county's earliest residents and industrial development.
